


Hope is Our Key

Home coaching Project

During the COVID-19 lockdown, the Home for Hope Foundation initiated a home coaching Project to ensure the children continued their education and maintained their academic progress. This program was designed to prevent learning loss and keep the children engaged in their studies despite the school closures. Through dedicated coaching sessions, we provided the necessary support and resources to help the children stay on track and prepare for their return to school.

Uniforms



At Home for Hope Foundation, we prioritize providing school uniforms annually for the children under our care. Most of these children come from impoverished backgrounds and many are orphans. As a result, they often lack adequate clothing and rely on their school uniforms not just for school but also as their primary attire at home. This dual usage means that the uniforms experience considerable wear and tear, necessitating yearly replacements to ensure that the children have appropriate and presentable clothing for school. By supplying new uniforms each year, we ensure that our children can attend school with dignity and confidence, reinforcing our commitment to their well-being and education.







The necessary School supplies

In 2020, despite the numerous challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, we ensured that the children under our care were well-prepared for their return to school. We provided them with all the necessary supplies, including uniforms, notebooks, bags, pens, pencils, and other essential items. This comprehensive support aimed to equip them with the tools they needed to succeed academically and foster a sense of normalcy and stability in their educational journey.

On this 24th December 2020 Official MoU of 5 years has been signed between Ministry of Health in Rwanda and Home for Hope Foundation.

The agreement concerns the donation of Albendazole 400mg for children aged 12-59 months to combat intestinal worms and prevent subsequent malnutrition in high endemic 17 districts.this program is covering more than 816,000 Children

What we found was heartbreaking; the family was living in conditions that were far from suitable, lacking basic necessities.

In 2020, the Home for Hope Foundation (HFHF) initiated a program to empower the mothers of the children we support by organizing them into groups aimed at enhancing economic resources.



These groups focused on small development projects, particularly in agriculture. This year, the mothers cultivated crops in two districts, Bugesera and Gasabo.

HFHF rented 3 hectares in Bugesera and 1.5 hectares in Gasabo, providing them with high-quality seeds, fertilizers, and cattle manure to boost production.





After a successful harvest, the maize was sold, and the profits were evenly distributed among the participants

AKIRA is Kinyarwanda word means "RECEIVE" we are giving pigs to the most marginalized communities and the poor families in Rwanda. We use this program to empower families and increase their productivity through their small livestock farming by getting nature manures.

During the implementation of AKIRA 2020, we shared life experiences and ways to overcome challenges with the beneficiaries. We also clarified our mission statement, emphasizing the possibility of achieving self-sustainability that can be passed on for generations to come.

Although it was not easy to implement, this initiative supported the government of Stay at Home program to fight against COVID-19 among our beneficiaries, ensuring their safety.

Success story of Mukarukaka Anisia's Journey:

Mukarukaka Anisia, a 32-year-old mother of four boys, was selected by her village in 2020 as one of the families in need of support. She was fortunate to receive a pig from the Home for Hope Foundation in it project of Akira 2020, which she raised and eventually sold to build an additional room for her children.

Determined to improve her life, Mukarukaka made a life-changing decision; she chose to stop having more children and returned to school, convinced that "she will make it." Remarkably, she became a student at the same school as three of her children.

However, she faced significant challenges in paying school fees. At times, her children were sent to her classroom by school authorities, asking for payment, saying, "Mom, the school authority was asking us for money."

Recognizing the family's need for comprehensive support, the Home for Hope Foundation decided to take in Mukarukaka's three children, ensuring they receive the care and education they deserve and covering her tuition fees as well.

In 2020, among the beneficiaries of the HFHF's Akira project 2020 was a family that had endured significant hardship. This family, which originally included two sets of twins, tragically lost one of the twins, leaving them with six members. Their daily struggle was focused on generating just income to provide food for the day.

Recognizing their need, HFHF provide them with two pigs. These pigs not only contributed manure for their kitchen garden, enhancing their agricultural productivity, but also supported their small-scale livestock farming efforts.

While this family received much-needed assistance, there are still many families in similar circumstances who remain in need of support. Unfortunately, due to limited funding, the Home for Hope Foundation has not yet been able to extend support to other families facing such challenges, including those with children who need access to education.

In 2020, the AKIRA project identified a handicapped mother who had been disabled since birth, living alone with her only son in a small house. Recognized by the village leader as a family in dire need of support, the Home for Hope Foundation stepped in to help.

Moved by her story, the HFHF made a special effort to donate two pigs to this mother, providing her with a means to improve her livelihood. This gesture was not just about giving; it was about empowering her to create a better life for herself and her son.

There are countless families like hers—living in loneliness and poverty—who are in desperate need of support. By joining hands with the Home for Hope Foundation, we can extend this impact to reach even more communities in need.

Covid-19 Response



Discussion summary

In March 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic reached Rwanda, impacting the country like the rest of the world.

To reduce the spread of the virus, the Rwandan government implemented strict measures, including a lockdown and country-wide restrictions. These measures, while necessary, created a significant challenge: many people were unable to work and struggled to find food while confined to their homes.

In response, the Home for Hope Foundation stepped in to support vulnerable children from impoverished families, particularly those with children already under our educational care. These families were in need of direct food assistance.
