Home for Hope Foundation Executive Summary

For 8 years [2016-2024], Home for Hope Foundation (HFHF) has transformed the lives of orphaned and vulnerable children and their families in Rwanda through holistic support in education, healthcare, and food-nutrition programs.

We have impacted 47 children through our education programs in secondary schools, primary schools, and nurseries and supported 389 under-five children in 22 Home-based education programs, ensuring they receive quality education towards self-sustainability. Our scholarship programs have enabled children from the most impoverished backgrounds especially orphans, to continue their education without the burden of financial constraints.

In healthcare, HFHF has provided essential services to over 810,000 children giving them Vitamin A and Albendazole 400mg in partnership with the Ministry of Health and Vitamin Angels, aiming to eliminate malnutrition. We have also provided health insurance to more than 200 children and their families. In late 2023, we established the Odenwald Clinic (odenwald.rw), currently serving 500+ patients monthly, with numbers expected to grow.

Our holistic support approach to a child includes the food-nutrition program, distributing pigs, forming agriculture groups, and establishing saving groups to enhance food security and economic stability for 160+ families.

Our 5-year strategy focuses on Partnership, Thought Leadership, Team Strengthening, and Resource Mobilization to expand services and impact. Join us in creating a future where our children blossom into adults who give back to the community.








Organizational Structure of the HFHF

The Home for Hope Foundation (HFHF) is dedicated to transforming lives through education, healthcare, and community support. Our organizational structure is designed to ensure efficient operation and effective service delivery. The Board of Directors are the providers of strategic oversight and governance. The Executive Director oversees daily operations, supported by a team of managers responsible for various departments, including Education, Healthcare, Community Outreach, and Finance.

This structure enables HFHF to maintain high standards of service and achieve sustainable growth.



Organizational Structure of the HFHF

This Structure has three main parts:

I. Top Management (General Assembly):

The General Assembly of the Home for Hope Foundation consists of three entities: The Board of Directors, The Board of Advisors, and The Executive Director.

The main and brief job description for top management:

Responsible for planning, organizing, and directing the organization's operations and programs. Develops and implements consistent inventory and cost accounting policies, procedures, and operational reporting. Oversees reports of the organization's results to the administrative managers.

II. Staff Members

Administrative manager and program managers may have several staff members assisting him/her to perform well the task and duties, the finance office is working independent to the staffs but it works closely with Executive Director and the board members.

III. Field officers, Volunteers & Consultants


This is the main part of the Home for Hope Foundation to perform well and on time the different tasks and duties of a given Project.



Problem Tree analysis

The Home for Hope Foundation is dedicated to improving the lives of vulnerable children through access to quality education. To better understand the challenges faced by these children and to develop effective strategies to address them, we have conducted a comprehensive Problem Tree analysis. We examine its root causes, immediate causes, and resulting effects. By breaking down the problem into these components, we can pinpoint specific areas that require intervention and develop targeted solutions to create meaningful change.

Solutions Addressing Root Causes

Improving Educational Program

- Scholarships and financial aid for tuition fees to support students.
- ❷ Providing necessary educational materials and resources.
- Offering training and mentorship to young children.
- ❷ Building and renovating schools.

Poverty Alleviation Program (Food-Nutrition Program)

- Initiating microfinance programs for parents (saving groups).
- Promoting agricultural initiatives and job creation through community grouping.
- Supporting farming, including livestock.

Health Interventions

- Constructing and operating a clinic (odenwald.rw) for regular health check-ups and healthcare.

5-Year Goals and Priorities



The Home for Hope Foundation's 5-Year Goals focus on sustainable growth, community empowerment, and resource provision for children's development, aiming to create lasting positive change for orphans and vulnerable children. These priorities will help build a stronger foundation and achieve our mission of providing hope and opportunities for every child.

Priority 1: Partnership

Enhance and expand our programs in Rwanda through strategic partnerships and training. HFHF will refine and scale our service model, focusing on quality. We will revise and upgrade the program to address evolving challenges in education, health, and sustainable development.

Objective 1.1: Expand Program Reach: Establish strategic partnerships with local and international organizations which will Increase the number of stakeholders served in areas with high poverty and vulnerability.

Objective 1.2: Enhance Resource Mobilization: Strengthen fundraising efforts and partnerships and Seek diverse funding sources for sustainability.

Objective 1.3: Improve Quality of Services: Refine service models for high-quality interventions and Implement regular training for staff and partners. Engage community leaders in program planning and Promote community ownership and sustainability.

Objective 1.4: Adapt to Changing Needs: Review and update program models regularly by Incorporate feedback from beneficiaries and partners.

Priority 2: Leadership (Teamwork)

Within this 5-Years the HFHF will focusing on leadership and teamwork with the aim to create a strong, cohesive, and innovative team that is capable of driving impactful change in the communities we serve.

Objective 2.1: Strengthen Organizational Leadership: Provide continuous leadership for HFHF board-members; volunteers and promote a collaborative work environment and finally Foster a culture of inclusivity.

Objective 2.2: Encourage Innovation and Creativity: Empower team members to bring innovative ideas.

Objective 2.3: Develop a Supportive Work Environment: Implement policies supporting physical and mental well-being, recognize and reward team members' efforts.

Objective 2.4: Strengthen Community Leadership: Collaborate with local community leaders to enhance their ability to lead and sustain local projects.





Priority 3: Education Program Enhancement

The Home for Hope Foundation aims to significantly enhance the educational outcomes for children in our Education program, We're expecting to see more of our students enroll in universities within this 5-Years.

Objective 3.1: Improve Educational Quality:Provide scholarships and financial support for school fees and supplies; Implement mentorship programs for academic and personal growth and engage parents and the community in supporting education.

Objective 3.2: Support Higher Education: Assist with university preparation, including academic counseling and test preparation; Provide scholarships for higher education and Offer career guidance and internships.



Priority 4: Health Program Enhancement

We are focused on expanding our clinic (<u>odenwald.rw</u>) and renewing our MoU with the Ministry of Health in Rwanda. Our goal is to continue and strengthen our robust program, servicing a large number of under-5 children, and to increase our reach beyond the current 81,000 children.

Objective 4.1: Expand Clinic Services: Increase clinic capacity to serve more children and families; Upgrade medical equipment and facilities, Expand the land for the future constructions.

Objective 4.2: Renew MoU with Ministry of Health: Strengthen collaboration with the Ministry of Health. Secure long-term commitments and resources.

Objective 4.3: Enhance Under-5 Program:Increase the number of uunder-five served beyond 810,000; Implement new health initiatives focused on preventive care and early intervention in partnership with Vitamin Angels.

Objective 4.4:Community Health Outreach: Conduct health education campaigns on child health and nutrition. Train community health workers to improve local healthcare practices.





Priority 5: Empowerment of Families

Empowerment of the Community starting to the families of the children the HFHF is helping in education program is essential for achieving long-term positive outcomes and ensuring the sustainability of our initiatives. creating a supportive and sustainable environment that enhances the overall well-being and development of the entire community.

Objective 5.1: Economic Empowerment: Microfinance Initiatives provide microloans and financial literacy training to families to support income-generating activities, Job Creation Programs develop and implement opportunities for family members, and Parental Involvement encourages and facilitates active parental participation in their children's education through workshops and support groups.

Objective 5.2: Health and Well-being: Ensure families have access to essential healthcare services, including preventive care and health education, and Nutrition Programs expand feeding programs to support the nutritional needs of the entire family.

Objective 5.3: Farming and Agriculture: Train families in sustainable farming techniques to improve crop yields and ensure food security, provide seeds, tools, and other necessary resources to support family farming activities, assist families in accessing markets to sell their agricultural products, thereby increasing their income and economic stability, and offer resources, training, and support for sustainable farming and livestock rearing.





Revenue Generation & Diversification for Home for Hope Foundation

To sustain and grow our programs, Home for Hope Foundation will seek new funding relationships to significantly increase our grant revenue. Investments in our projects. We will not only provide essential inputs for our initiatives and serve as a community resource hub but also create new revenue streams and innovative ways to engage with our community.
