To promote the living conditions of vulnerable people as well as protecting them and increase their income generation, eradicating poverty.



Areas of Interventions

The Home for Hope Foundation is dedicated to making a meaningful impact and instilling hope in communities for generations to come through quality education as the cornerstone of its initiatives. Other initiatives including; health program, food & nutrition program, and events program.

Education Program

We provide children with all necessary school supplies, including school fees, uniforms, shoes, notebooks, bags, mattresses and transportation fees for secondary school students.

Health Program

- We support access to health services by paying for health insurance.
- We partner with the Ministry of Health and Vitamin Angels to provide Vitamin A and Albendazole to more that 810,000 children.
- Sanitation and Hygiene (SAH).

Food & Nutrition Program

- We are empowering mothers through agricultural and other projects to increase their income generation
- The Akira Project involves providing pigs to the most marginalized communities and poor families.
- We are working to combat stunting among children under the age of five.


This concerted effort lays a solid foundation, paving the way for a brighter and promising future for each child under our care.

Nu-Vision High School's students visit

On Saturday, 3rd June 2023, students from The Nu-Vision High School (NVHS) visited the orphan children at the Home for Hope Foundation, During the visit, they engaged in meaningful interactions, and we sincerely appreciate the students for bringing gifts that reflect their values and aspirations.

Our next step is to pursue a potential partnership with the school authorities to secure at least three scholarships for the children from the Home for Hope Foundation.

We're thrilled to announce that we've successfully secured two sponsorships for deserving young girls, a testament to our ongoing dedication and the generosity of our supporters. As we continue to forge partnerships and strive towards our goals, we extend our heartfelt appreciation for the invaluable support received.



Controlling intestinal worms

The Home for Hope Foundation is actively combating intestinal worms and preventing subsequent malnutrition across 18 highly endemic districts, this year 2023 this project is benefiting over 851,000 children.

This health program is conducted in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and Vitamin Angels. In our efforts to ensure transparency and accountability, we are pleased to share images of the tablets (medicines) supplied, carefully stored in the central-level medical store named Rwanda medical Suply (RMS).



Response to the rain-floods in May 2023.

The devastating floods in the western province have tragically claimed 135 lives and displaced numerous individuals from their homes, forcing them to seek shelter in camps with tents.

In response, the Home for Hope Foundation has prioritized addressing the health needs of the affected population, with a particular emphasis on sanitation. We have made concerted efforts to ensure that everyone, especially children under the age of five, receives necessary medical attention.

Collaborating with various NGOs and institutions, we have implemented a comprehensive program aimed at controlling Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs) within the camps.






Odenwald Health Post (OHP)

- *Increase income generation;
- *Improvement of the harvest using organic manures;
- *Fighting against Malnutrition of the children (We recommend all of them to have Vegetable gardens).

We are delighted to announce that the Akira Project 2023 has exceeded its target of 50 pigs and successfully acquired 51 pigs and 51 fruit trees for the children to be distributed which means that 51 families have been served.

This was done into two seasons: the 1st season has been implemented on this 30th May and the second on 18th Nov 2023.



Empowering mothers through agriculture

Our main goal for this year was to augment the food supply in the kitchens of these families. This ensures that the children participating in our education program have access to nourishing meals upon returning from school, thereby enhancing their contribution to the overall success of the school results.



This project has been implemented in two ways:

- 1. Group Collaboration: Mothers are organized into a single group that collectively rents a large plot of land. They work together on this plot and share the harvest equally among themselves.
- 2. Individual Empowerment: Each mother is also assisted in acquiring a small plot of land for personal cultivation. They work independently on their own plots and use the harvest for their own needs.

These approaches aim to foster both community cooperation and individual self-sufficiency, providing diverse opportunities for improving their livelihoods.

Food and Nutrition Empowering mothers through agricultural

Approaches Used:

- Providing fertilizers/manures and high-quality seeds for them to use in their individual gardens. For those without plots of land, we have made efforts to secure rental plots.
- Grouping them and renting larger plots of land, encouraging collaborative efforts. We provide fertilizers/manures and high-quality seeds in this shared setting as well as they will share the harvest.

This nourishing breakfast porridge is made from flour, sugar, and water. The flour, known as SOSOMA, is a blend of sorghum, soy, and maize. This blend is especially important for young children as it provides essential nutrients for their growth and development, ensuring they start their day with a healthy and balanced meal. The combination of these grains offers a rich source of protein, vitamins, and minerals, contributing to their overall well-being.
