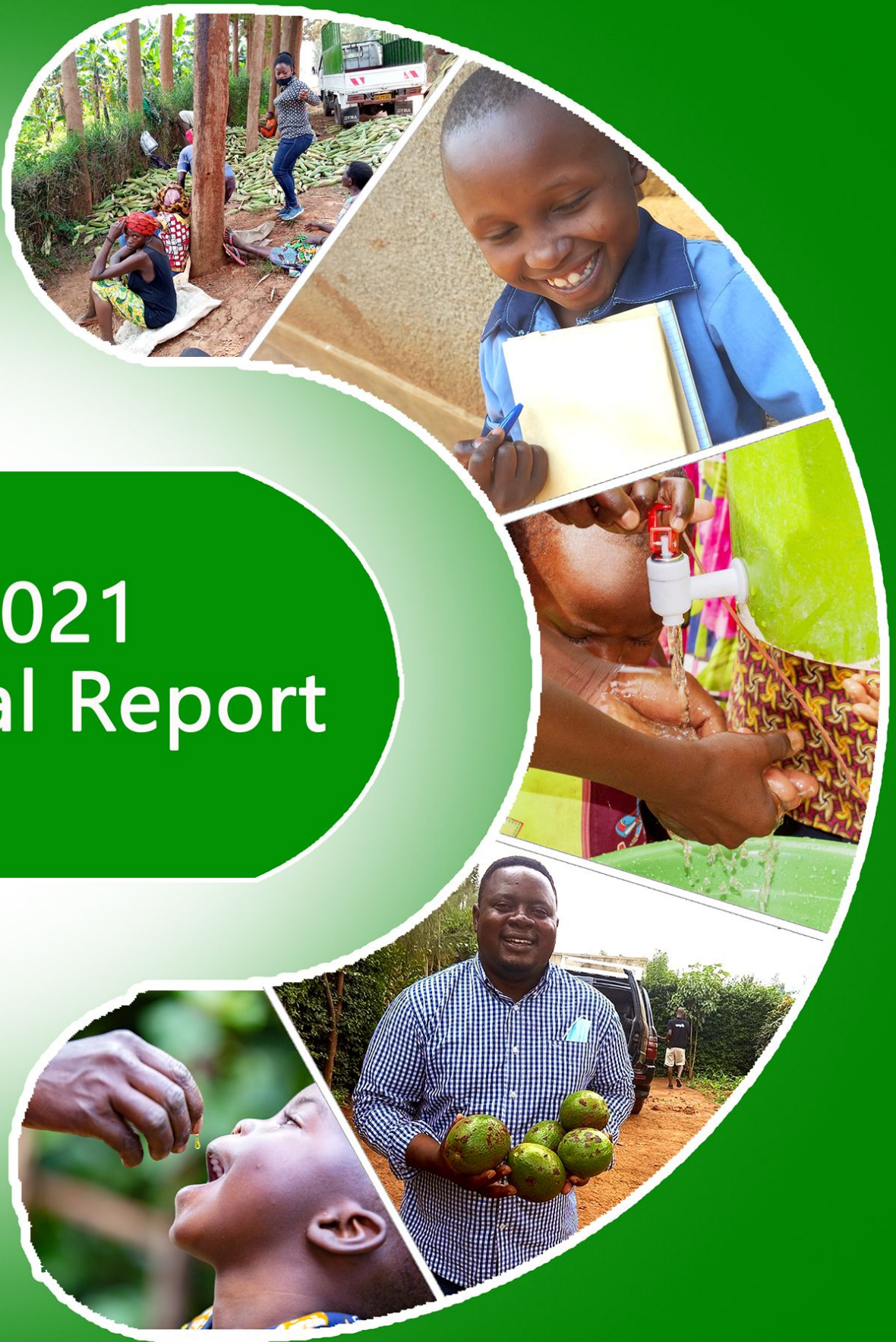

Our Goal



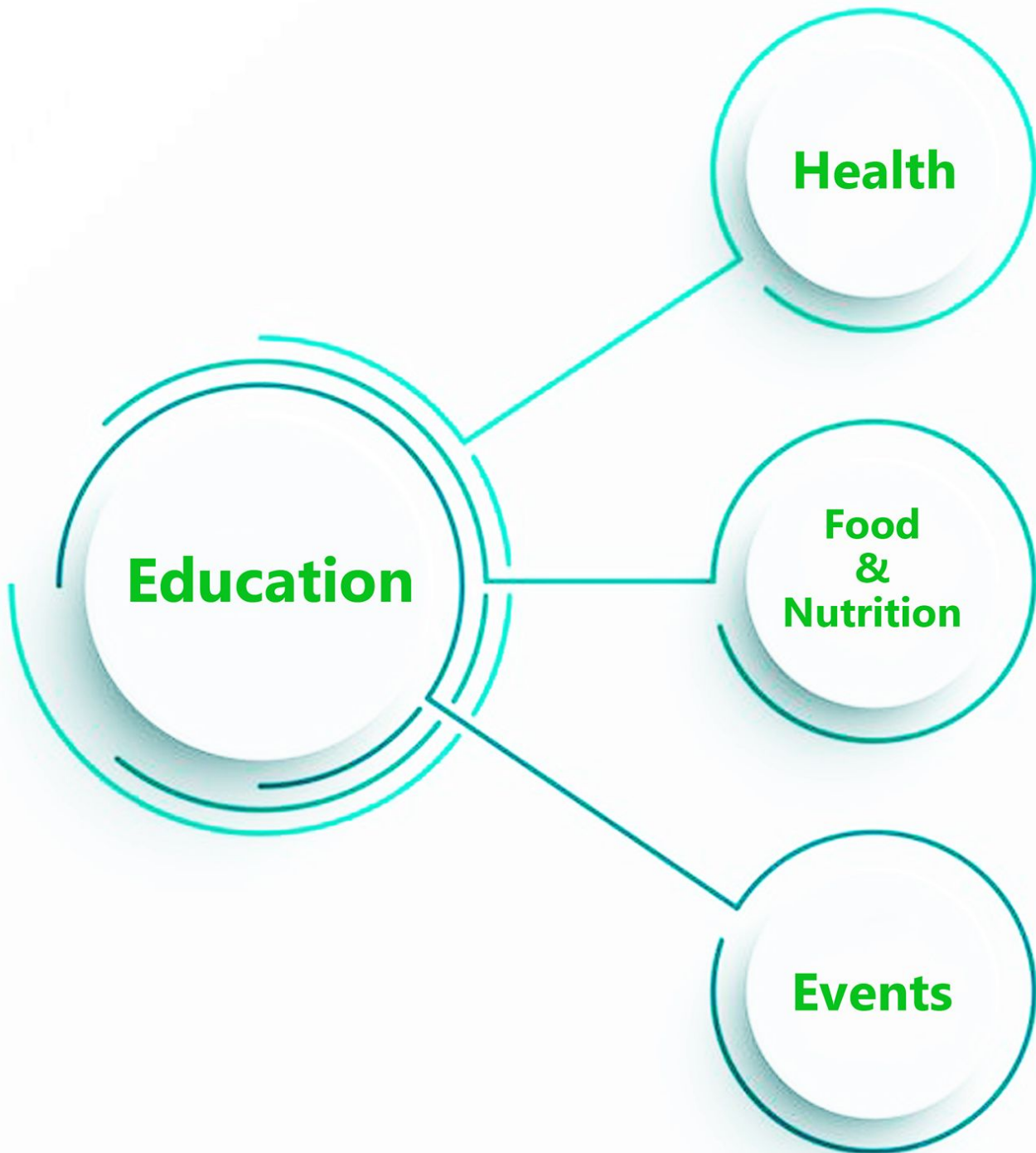
- ▶ Provide each child Girls and boys with an education & care.

Home for Hope Foundation Interventions



All of Home for Hope Foundation's interventions support education to empower children towards self-sustainability future that can be passed on for generations to come.

Areas of Intervention

The Home for Hope Foundation is dedicated to making a meaningful impact and instilling hope in communities for generations to come through quality **education** as the cornerstone of its initiatives.

Other initiatives include **health programs, food & nutrition programs, and events.**

Education Program

We provide support for children by providing them with all necessary school supplies, including school fees, uniforms, shoes, notebooks, bags, and even mattresses, transportations for secondary school students.

Health Program

- ▶ We support access to health services by paying for health insurance.
- ▶ We also partner with the Ministry of Health and Vitamin Angels to provide Vitamin A and Albendazole to more than 810,000 children.
- ▶ Sanitation and Hygiene (SAH).

Food & Nutrition Program

- ▶ We are empowering mothers through agricultural and other projects to increase their income generation
- ▶ The Akira Project involves providing pigs to the most marginalized communities and poor families.
- ▶ We are working to combat stunting among children under the age of five.

Events

Each year, we celebrate a Christmas event where we gather with more than 80 children to share food and drinks, and then give gifts to make them happy at least for one day in the life.

Education Program

Home for Hope Foundation this school year 2021/2022 is giving access to the education to 33 children from the families which can't afford to send their children to school (poor families).

1 Boy in secondary school, Other 32 still in Primary school.

15 in Upper classes and 15 in lower primary and 2 in Nursery.

Every child has the right to go to school and Study well without any exception, promoting sustained access to quality education is our focused point and the basement.

Child eligibility

All the children eligible to this project are the children selected using all the tools and criteria set by the foundation after considering existing finance and other methods that are applicable to the child and community development.

Mainly children with very high performance in class; more specifically:

- Orphan Children;
- Children from women heads of households;
- Children vulnerable to failed marriages;
- Underprivileged children;
- Children with disability or from disabled parents'.

Before starting this Academic year 2021/2022 that has started in Oct/2021 and that will end in July 2022, Home for Hope Foundation has invited the meeting with all the parents that have the children who are getting education and care support from the foundation and talked about the following:

Before the beginning of the academic year 2021/2022, we gathered all the children in our education program who were at the nursery, primary, and secondary levels. We shared stories and an inspiring message from the founder, played games, prayed, shared food, and gave everyone their uniforms, books, and pens. Then they went home with full packages to facilitate them in the 2021/2022 academic year. Below are the highlights of this day!

Health Program

Home for Hope Foundation(HFHF) is a Charity Organization that Helps Children in Rwanda within their education and health (where ***we are controlling intestinal worms and prevent subsequent malnutrition in high endemic districts***).

Among the benefits that children receive to help them study well are health insurance (mutuelle de santé), which gives them access to medical treatment after they have paid.

Specific Objectives

- * Elimination of intestinal worms at district and community level in high endemic districts.
- * To reduce micronutrient deficiency in high endemic districts for intestinal worms.

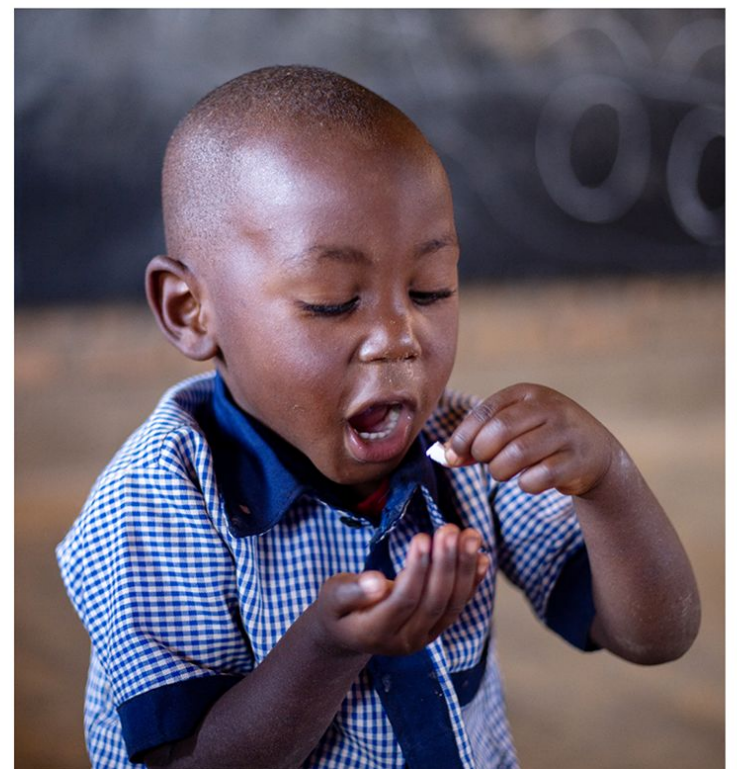

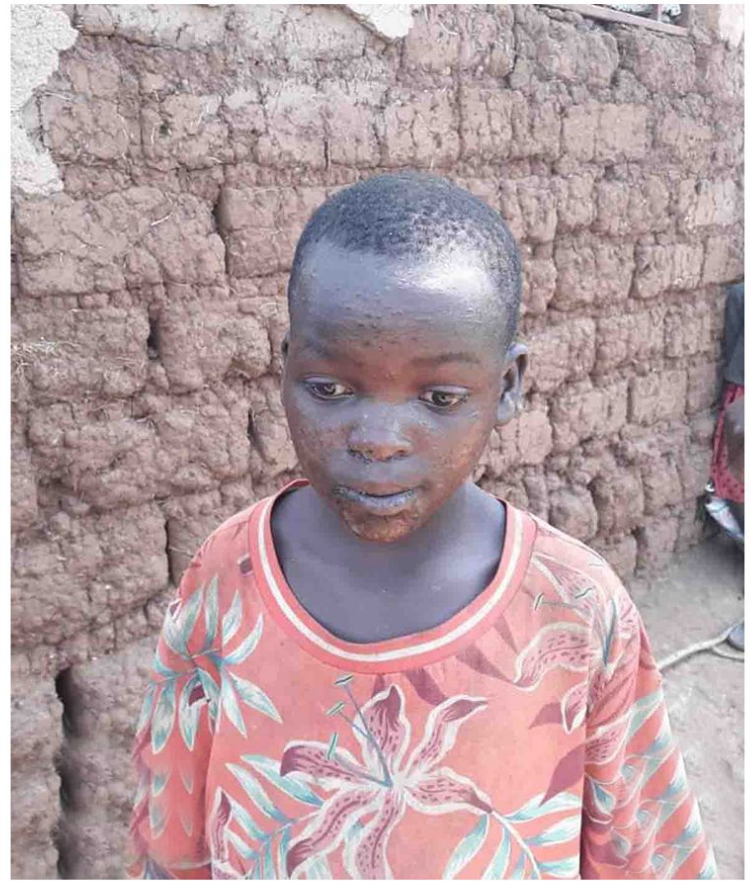


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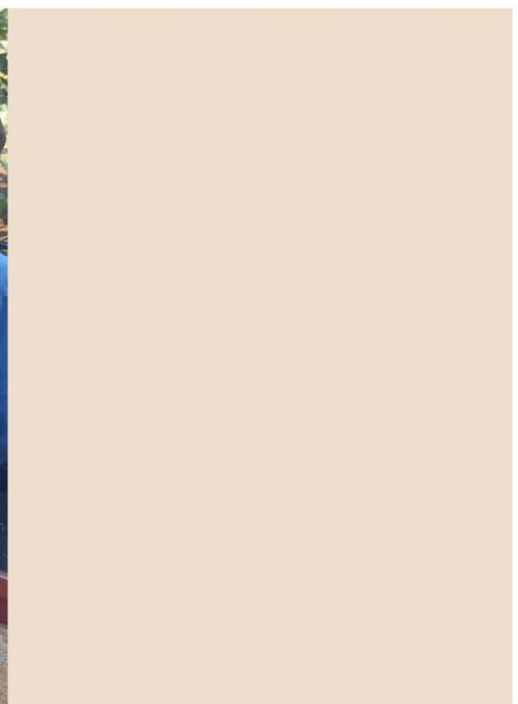

Health Program



Take your time and think about a little girl who was born and grew up like other children. However, due to her parents' life experiences, she used to go find grass for their rabbit every day, which became her daily routine. One day, while she was cutting grass as usual, unfortunately, she was bitten by an insect or snake, and its toxin spread through her body, making her sick. Even though she was in the Home for Hope Foundation's education program, she received extra care to manage her sickness. After the treatment, she became well and returned to school.



Food and Nutrition Program

Agriculture

Tuzamurane Group is the mothers of the children that Home for Hope Foundation supports; we have grouped the mothers for promoting the economic resources of group members by creating small development projects.

Steps which have been carried out:

I. Looking for the plots to rent

We have rented 1 hectare of land for two years in Bugesera District.



II. Plots preparation (Agriculture)

The beneficiaries has been participated in their project doing Agriculture and they are paid twice of the normal wages in order to promote them.

Steps which have been carried out:

III. Irrigation System in Bugesera

Because of the water problems in the Bugesera Region, we have managed to dig two large and deep pits to find underground water for irrigation and have bought a good pump (for pumping the water) from KOSHIN in Japan.



IV Cattle manure and fertilizers, Seeds and Manpower for seeding were provided

Home for Hope Foundation has paid for cattle manure, fertilizers, seeds, and manpower for planting seedlings to improve the quantity and quality of production

Maize and Money sharing

As the plants grew, they produced the expected yield. We sowed the maize, and some of the production was sold while the rest was shared among the beneficiaries. The money was then shared by the Tuzamurane women's group.



Food and Nutrition Program

AKIRA Project

AKIRA IS Kinyarwanda word means "RECEIVE" we are giving pigs to the most marginalized communities and the poor families in Rwanda.

We use this program to empower families and increase their productivity through their small livestock farming by getting nature manures.

According to the fundraising done from 7th December 2021 to 2nd January 2022, Home for Hope received 30 pigs from different donors worldwide. We are grateful to all donors who supported our AKIRA project from the Food and Nutrition Program, which is one of our initiatives.



Project main objectives:

- ★ Increase income generation.
- ★ Improvement of the harvest using organic manures.
- ★ Fighting against Malnutrition of the children
(We recommend all of them to have Vegetable gardens).
